

Start and finish near MPEC.







- Fun ride, not a race
















RAGBRAI – Daily rides at a glance

- Day 1 Sioux City to Storm Lake 77 miles 3,504 feet gain
- Day 2 Storm Lake to Carroll
 62 miles 1,818 feet gain
- Day 3 Carroll to Ames
 83 miles 1,479 feet gain
- Day 4 Ames to Des Moines 50 miles 1,215 feet gain

- Day 5 Des Moines to Tama-Toledo 82 miles 3,652 feet gain
- Day 6 Tama-Toledo to Coralville 82 miles 3.303 feet gain
- Day 7 Coralville to Davenport 66 miles 1,604 feet gain

Ride Name - Logistics

- Starts in Sioux City
- Completes in Davenport ride
- Lodging options are numerous: RVs, tents, buses, hotels, etc.
- Personal sag vehicle, group buss or other, bags in RAGBRAI transport truck
- Support is available in each town by vendors
- Food sold along route
